

John Maloy selected as World Class Student of the Week

The sequence of rigorous coursework that Maloy has been taking is research-proven to provide the skills and knowledge for success in college and the workplace. Once a student has completed, or is near to completing this sequence of courses, they are eligible for nomination as a World Class Student of the Week. Fifty-two New Jersey students have been selected and will be featured on the New Jersey Learn Do Earn Web site (www.LearnDoEarn.org) and honored at a

The criteria a World Class Student must achieve in order to successfully finish the program includes completing – or almost completing with a high probability of a passing grade – the following sequence of courses: Algebra I, Algebra II, and Geometry; Biology, Chemistry and Physics; four years college-prep English; two years of the same world language; and three years of Social Studies; which includes one semester of economics.
