

Bergen County schools recognized for high achievement

Several Bergen County schools were recently named 2007 Just for the Kids: New Jersey Benchmark Schools for attaining high rates of student achievement on state tests.

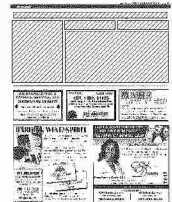
Bergen County's Benchmark Schools include the Dwight D. Eisenhower Middle School in Wyckoff, George Washington Middle School and Ridgewood High School in Ridgewood, and Ramsey High School.

Benchmark Schools are schools designated by the Business Coalition for Educational Excellence at the New Jersey Chamber of Commerce using data from the state's High School Proficiency Assessment, Grade Eight Proficiency Assessment, or NJ ASK (Assessment of Skills and Knowledge). A total of 73 schools throughout the state received this honor.

Just for the Kids helps educators analyze data about their schools to use toward creating blueprints for improvement or continued success.
